# MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF THE HIGH POWERED COMMITTEE HELD ON 17<sup>TH</sup> AUGUST, 2022 AT 02:00 P.M. CHAIRED BY HON'BLE EXECUTIVE CHAIRPERSON, SIKKIM SLSA/CHAIRPERSON, HIGH POWERED COMMITTEE THROUGH VIRTUAL MODE

#### AGENDA ITEMS

A. Item Agenda No.1: Confirmation of the Minutes of the Meeting of the High Powered Committee held via Video Conference on 20<sup>th</sup> May, 2022.

The minutes of the meeting held on 20<sup>th</sup> May, 2022, is approved and confirmed.

B. Item Agenda No.2: DECONGESTION OF JAILS

To consider list of Undertrial Prisoners (UTPs)/Convicts eligible for consideration on Bail;

- (a) To consider Convicts who have undergone their sentence or are entitled to remission/suspension/commutation of sentence under Sections 432 and 432A of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973 (for short, "Cr.P.C.") and Furlough in terms of the Sikkim Prison Manual;
  - (I) The State Central Prison, Rongyek, East Sikkim: NIL
  - (II) The District Prison, Boomtar, Namchi, South Sikkim: NIL
  - (III) Home Department, Government of Sikkim:
    - a) In exercise of the powers conferred by Section 432 of the Cr. P.C., 1973 (2 of 1974), the Government of Sikkim will be granting remission of sentence to 77 Convicts lodged in the State Central Prison, Rongyek on the occasion of 76<sup>th</sup> Independence Day, 2022.
    - b) Further, in exercise of the powers conferred under Article 161 of the Constitution of India, the Hon'ble Governor of Sikkim on the recommendation of the State Level Screening Committee constituted vide Notification bearing No. 68/Home/2022 dated 15.07.2022, has been pleased to grant special remission and has ordered for release of the following three Convicts on the occasion of 76<sup>th</sup> Independence Day, 2022.

- 4. Palden Bhutia @ Pema Bhutia admitted in prison on 15.09.2021 u/S 7/9/14 of SADA, 2006 r/w Sec. 9(1)(b) of SAD Amendment Act, 2017 r/w Sec. 22/27 of NDPS Act, 1985.

\*Note: The Hon'ble Executive Chairperson, Sikkim SLSA/Chairperson, High Powered Committee suggested that first time offenders who are involved in cases under NDPS Act, 1985/SADA, 2006 (consumption) and have undergone six months in the Prisons should be considered for release on bail or sent to Rehabilitation Centres for detoxification and rehabilitation.

## State Central Prison, Rongyek

Sumit Tamang, aged 20, r/o Naxalbari, West Bengal, currently residing at Hotel Opera, Hungry Jack, Gangtok, Sikkim, admitted in Prison on 20.04.2022 u/S 363/376 of IPC 1860 r/w Sec. 04 of POCSO Act, 2012.

- (g) To consider release of UTPs who are imprisoned for offences which carry a maximum punishment of 2 years;

# (h) To consider release of vulnerable UTPs who are sick or infirm and require specialized medical treatment;

It was informed by Shri Sharab Tonyot, Deputy Inspector General, State Central Prison and Member, High Powered Committee that in the case of UTP Rohit Khawas admitted in Prison on 17.08.2021 u/S 5(j)(ii)/6 of POCSO Act, 2012, who was suffering from Mycobacterium Tuberculosis, his test result has come negative and he is currently under medication (*DOTS*).

With regard to UTP Phurba Tamang admitted in Prison on 22.02.2022 u/S 341/392/34 of IPC, 1860, who is suffering from HIV, the Deputy Inspector General, State Central Prison undertakes to monitor the activities of the Prison Inmates who are housed in the same cell with the said accused.

Only one female UTP is there in State Central Prison, Rongyek

- C. Item Agenda No.3: UTPs and Convicts with Covid-19 in the State Central Prison, Rongyek, East Sikkim and District Prison, Boomtar, Namchi, South Sikkim and availability of medical facilities and treatment.

#### State Central Prison, Rongyek and District Prison, Boomtar

Vide letter bearing No. 543/SCP/J/2022 dated 17.05.2022 received from Assistant Superintendent of Prison, State Central Prison, Rongyek and 98/ASP/DPN/S dated 17.05.2022, received from Assistant Superintendent of Prison, District Prison, Boomtar, it has been informed that required medical facilities are available in both the Prisons. No UTPs or Convicts in either of the Prisons are suffering from COVID-19 as of now.

D. Item Agenda No.4: Continuation of sanitization and maintenance of hygiene and cleanliness in the State Central Prison, Rongyek, East Sikkim and District Prison, Boomtar, Namchi, South Sikkim.

It was brought to the notice of the meeting by Shri Sharab Tonyot, Deputy Inspector General, State Central Prison and Member, High Powered Committee that sanitization of the Prison is being carried out on a fortnightly basis as the chemical used (*Sodium Hydrochloride*) is said to be carcinogenic.

On the other hand, it was informed by Shri Bijoy Subba, Assistant Superintendent of Prison, District Prison, Boomtar and Member, High Powered Committee that sanitization of the Prison is being caried out on alternate days.

Considering that the chemical used (*Sodium Hydrochloride*) is carcinogenic, it was suggested by the Hon'ble Executive Chairperson, Sikkim SLSA/Chairperson, High Powered Committee that the sanitization of Prisons be carried out on a fortnightly basis. However, use of phenyl and other cleaning agents to be used on a daily basis for maintaining cleanliness and hygiene.

E. Item Agenda No.5: Number of new UTPs since 20-05-2022 and the latest vaccination position of UTPs, Convicts, Officers and staff at the State Central Prison, Rongyek, East Sikkim and District Prison, Boomtar, Namchi, South Sikkim.

#### **State Central Prison, Rongyek**

It was informed by Deputy Inspector General, State Central Prison, Rongyek, that vaccination of inmates in the Prisons are carried out as per their vaccination schedule and as and when request is made to the Health & Family Welfare Department who are also obliging to their request.

The Hon'ble Executive Chairperson, Sikkim SLSA/Chairperson, High Powered Committee suggested that vaccination should be taken up as per the time period directed by the Central Government and it should be ensured that all the inmates are vaccinated with both doses and the precautionary dose against COVID-19.

F. Item Agenda No.6: Present mode of production of UTPs before Courts and continuation of Video Conference for remand.

#### State Central Prison, Rongyek and District Prison, Boomtar

Vide letter bearing No. 688/SCP/J/2022 dated 12.08.2022 received from Superintendent of Prison, State Central Prison, Rongyek and 196/ASP/DPN/S dated 12.08.2022, received from Additional Superintendent of Prison, District Prison, Boomtar, it has been informed that all the UTPs required to be produced for remand to various Learned Courts are being produced through Video Conferencing.

G. Item Agenda No.7: Steps taken for and progress of counselling of UTPs and Convicts by Psychologists and Psychiatrists at the State Central Prison, Rongyek, East Sikkim and District Prison, Boomtar, Namchi, South Sikkim (UTPs, convicts under SADA and UTPs, convicts with mental illness, other UTPs and convicts in need of counselling);

It was informed by the Hon'ble Executive Chairperson, Sikkim SLSA/Chairperson, High Powered Committee that the present mode of counselling for the UTPs and convicts booked under the NDPS Act, 1985 or the Sikkim Anti Drugs Act, 2006 (SADA, 2006), is via Video conferencing every Monday, Wednesday and Friday from the Office of Sikkim SLSA, however, as informed by the Counsellors, the said programme

was not found to be very effective on account of the online interaction not being as good as one to one counselling. Hence, it was enquired by her Ladyship from the Additional Chief Secretary, Home Department and the Jail Authorities whether it was now feasible for the Counsellors of the Rehabilitation Centres to visit the State Central Prison for the purpose of providing physical counselling of the said inmates while duly maintaining the COVID-19 protocol.

In this regard, it was informed by the Deputy Inspector General, State Central Prison that in view of the COVID-19 protocol, visitors are not allowed inside the Prison, which was also confirmed by Shri Ravindra Telang, Additional Chief Secretary, Home Department & Member, High Powered Committee, who further informed that the said protocol may continue for a month or two.

It was further informed by the Deputy Inspector General, State Central Prison that currently 30 (*thirty*) UTPs avail counselling on the above scheduled days from the Library Hall of the Prison.

In this context, it was suggested by Her Ladyship that in order to make the counselling sessions effective, instead of thirty UTPs in one group, three groups of ten UTPs each should be made, who could then be counselled in three different batches by the counsellors from the Rehabilitation Centres on the scheduled days, as per the availability of the Counsellors.
